The Department of Family Services has completed the investigation regarding alleged violation(s) of the Wyoming Child Care Rules received on 05/28/2026, and investigated by Teddie Schroyer.

A statement of childcare allegation, CPL-6124, was provided on 06/02/2026.

Allegation: It has been reported that in the last 3 months, children have had access to over-the-counter medications.

Explanation of Findings: Based on interviews and information gathered during the investigation, it was determined that one occasion in the past three months, a child was able to access an employee's over-the-counter medication from their purse.

Action Required: Please submit a corrective action plan detailing how you will ensure that all medications and hazardous items, including staff's personal items, and those in stored in children's' diaper bags, will be placed out of reach and inaccessible to children at all times. In addition, please include how all staff will be notified of this requirement and how the space will be monitored to ensure compliance with the new storage procedures.

If you disagree with the Department's finding of non-compliance for a violation, you may request an Administrative hearing within (10) days of your receipt of this letter (W.S. 14-4-108). Administrative hearing procedures are included in the Department of Family Services' **Wyoming Child Care Licensing Rules, Chapter 3, Section 5: Contested Case Hearing Rules**, and based upon the above statute. If you have questions, or need a copy of the Rules, you may contact the Department of Family Services Field office in the county where you live.
