The Department of Family Services has completed the investigation regarding alleged violation(s) of the Wyoming Child Care Rules received on 07/22/2022, and investigated by Michelle Tucker.

A statement of childcare allegation, CPL-5314, was provided on 08/03/2022.

The finding is listed below for each individual alleged violation of the Wyoming Child Care Licensing Rules:

1. Finding: Non-Compliant

Regulation: Chapter 4. General Requirements

Section 10. Records.

(d) Individual child's records shall be in place before a child is left in care and shall include:

(iii) Names, addresses and telephone numbers of persons authorized to take the child from the facility. Children may not be released to unauthorized persons without prior parent approval and proper identification;

Allegation: It has been self reported by the facility that on July 21, 2022, a child in care was released to an unknown individual, who was not authorized to pick the child up and no identification was asked for or verified.

Explanation of Findings: Through interviews and evidence obtained over the course of this investigation, it has been found that on July 21, 2022, a child in care was released to an individual unknown to the facility. This individual was not authorized to pick up the child and no identification was asked for or verified before the child was released.

Action Required: The staff member responsible for the release of the child, DL, has been terminated from employment at the facility. Complete a corrective action plan detailing how the facility will ensure that all children at the facility are released to only authorized individuals.
