The Department of Family Services has completed the investigation regarding alleged violation(s) of the Wyoming Child Care Rules received on 10/11/2019, and investigated by Michelle Tucker

A statement of childcare allegation, CPL-44446, was provided on 10/11/2019.

The finding is listed below for each individual alleged violation of the Wyoming Child Care Licensing Rules:

## 1. Finding: Non-Compliant

Regulation: Chapter 4. General Requirements

Section 3. Provider, Director, and Staff Requirement

(a) Before the provider, director, their staff, household member, substitute or volunteer assume responsibility for the direct care of children, work in the facility or move into the Family Child Care Home or Family Child Care Center, the following shall be on file:

(iii) A child abuse/neglect Central Registry check which does not reveal any disqualifying information.

Explanation of Findings: Upon an unannounced visit on October 11, 2019, it was found that a staff member's central registry had expired in January of 2019. The central registry screening has not been rerun since January of 2018 and the employee is working in the facility.

Action Required: Immediately completed a new central registry for employee CC. Complete the enclosed corrective action plan describing how the facility will maintain compliance with the requirement of having current central registry on file for all employees at all times.

Action Met Comments: Employee CC submitted central registry form on the day of the visit and it has been processed and is on file. Received acceptable Corrective Action Plan for ensuring staff will have current central registry at all times.

The Department's information may be shared with authorized individuals or agencies, which include, but are not limited to, the Attorney General, County Attorney, and law enforcement.

If you disagree with the Department's finding of a non-compliance violation, you may request an Administrative hearing within (10) days of your receipt of this letter (W.S. 14–4–108). Administrative hearing procedures are included in the Wyoming Department of Family Services Contested Case Hearing Rules, Chapter 2, Substitute Care and Child Care Licensing and based on the above statute. If you need a copy of the Rules, or assistance in requesting an Administrative hearing, you may contact the Department of Family Services Field Office in the county where you live.
